## ❖ Dress for the Weather

As a reminder, we send students outside at recess as long as the temperature is above ten degrees. Proper attire (coats, hats, gloves, and boots) for outdoor recess is a must.

## ❖ Just a reminder:

Last minute phone calls are discouraged. Phone calls should only be for an emergency situation. Please send a note with your child in the morning if there is a change in transportation.

Our cafeteria offers a **FREE** breakfast every morning. Students are encouraged to get a healthy breakfast. Students arriving at school later than 8:25 will not be served breakfast. Please be sure your child is here between 7:45 and 8:19 in order to have breakfast. Class starts at 8:19 and students should be in their classroom at that time



## BULLYING, HARASSMENT AND HARMFUL BEHAVIOR

As prevention of bullying, harassment, rumor spreading and harmful behavior to oneself or others, students need to tell an adult they trust if they are victims or observe such behavior. They may tell their parents, a teacher, principal, etc. See the student handbook regarding school policy on bullying, sexual harassment and intimidation. Make sure all violators are **reported to school authorities** so corrective action may be taken. Students should also keep an eye out for depression in themselves or others and talk to someone they trust if anyone speaks of harming themselves or others including suicidal thoughts or attempts. **It's okay to ask for help.**

For some Hale students, facing responsibility is a daily challenge. If your child struggles academically and routinely states that, "they have no homework, they did it all in class and/or have all their assignments turned in," double check with the staff on the **www.haleschools.net** website. Go to the middle school site and check out the staff directory. You may send them an e-mail from that site or call and leave a message on their phone. If your child has a planner insist that they fill it out every day for each class they have.
